Children of Chernobyl

What do you think of when you hear the word Chernobyl? On April 16, 1986 the worst nuclear accident in history took place at the Chernobyl nuclear power plant in the Soviet Ukraine. The reactor exploded sending over eight tons of radioactive toxins and debris three miles into the atmosphere. For ten days the fire emitted particles 90 times more deadly than those released from Hiroshima and Nagasaki. It is estimated that three million people, nearly one million of them children from the republics of Belarus, Ukraine, and Russia are suffering the effects of radioactive fallout on their lands and waterways. Contaminated soil and air still pose risks of thyroid cancer and leukemia to the children who live there.

Children of Chernobyl is one of many groups in Europe, North America, and Asia that have organized relief efforts to bring out some of the children living in areas affected by the explosion at the Chernobyl nuclear plant. The children come from low-income families who would have little or no opportunity for recuperation without assistance.

A group of children between the ages of 8 and 12 visit the U.S. annually for 6 to 8 weeks between late June and early August. In addition, an interpreter accompanies the children to help ease the communication barriers. By removing them from the contamination, their immune systems begin to function normally and their bodies are better able to fight off the effects of the radiation. The children come with nothing but the clothes on their backs. They are matched with host families who have children of the same age and are provided with healthy food, fresh air, sunshine, exercise, and of course, love. The children also receive medical check-ups, dental treatments, and eye care while they are here. These services are donated by local doctors and hospitals.



The Washington Jaycees are proud to sponsor a picnic for the visiting children and their host families each year. This is an opportunity for the Jaycees to show this organization how much we admire the hosting families for their devotion to these children and show the children a good time. This past year, they enjoyed their first visit from an ice-cream truck and believe me, it was like Christmas.

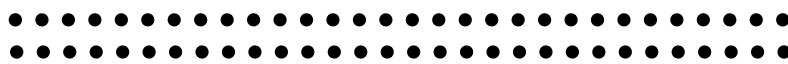

Dear Curious,

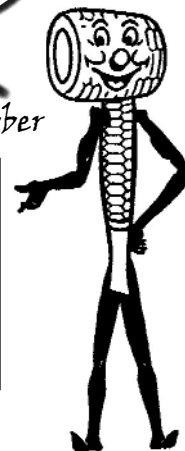
We get our state and national ranking by participating in a program called POC. POC stands for Parade of Chapters. The Jaycee year is divided into trimesters, and each trimester we compile a packet to send to the state office as well as the national office. Both the state and national office provide a packing list that assigns point values to several of our normal activities. We earn points for visiting other chapters, donating money to specific charities, and writing CPG's (Chairpersons Planning Guide) on our events. We will be compiling our first POC packet of the year on March 30. I would encourage you to attend to see what is involved in the process. 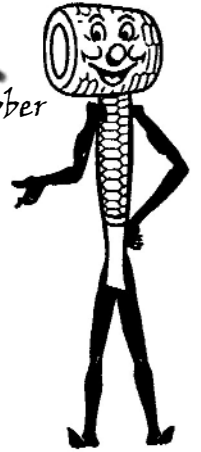
